Mt. deVeber Trail Restoration

The first four Senators from Alberta had mountains named after them. Their names were Hardisty, Lougheed, deVeber and Talbot. Mt. Lougheed is named after Peter Lougheed's Grandfather and Mt. Hardisty was named after Richard Hardisty. Trail systems and information about these two mountains are available to Albertans, making both of them accessible.

Mt. Talbot and Mt. deVeber are located on the north-western boundary of Willmore Wilderness Park. The trails are inaccessible and obstructed by deadfall and washed out trails. The focus of the Foundations 2003 Project is to restore the trail systems of Mt. deVeber. Three 21-day trips are planned for the trail restoration initiatives.



The Foundation will be preparing for publication, written record/photos of the 2003 restoration initiatives along with the previously written journals/ photos of the trail clearing expeditions in the same vicinity.
